The oldest park in Toronto and the centre of our renowned Heritage District needs a facelift. Cabbagetown Art & Crafts, the organization that has run the sale in the park during the Festival for the past 27 years, generously donated \$5,000 to the City of Toronto to get the pathways paved with concrete. The sale of bricks has raised another \$25,000 which has resulted in the construction of two pathways and the patio in front of farm. We need to finish the job so now is the time for Cabbagetowners to invest in the future of our wonderful neighbourhood.

You can purchase a brick engraved with your name, the name of a loved one, "in memoriam" to the departed or even to a favourite pet. It will be placed permanently at the centre of the park. It is a chance never to be repeated for you to put your dedication to aid in this historic park's renovation.

The solid line indicates an 8X8" block; the dotted line indicates a 4X8" block. If you wish to see how your brick will look, print the letters in the order you prefer. The only typeface is a plain, non-serif typeface like this one. Letters will be made as large as possible, so the fewer the letters, the larger the type. Small letters tend to wear more quickly than large ones but if you wish, you may put more lines on the stone than the two or four recommended. You will be contacted if there are problems.
